Lieutenant Colonel Christina Peace is the Air Force Medical Service Chief, Radiation Health, Air Force Medical Readiness Agency, Falls Church, Va. She leads radiation health policy development, provides radiation safety guidance for the Air Force, and manages radioactive material permitting actions for the Air Force's sole Master Material License.

Lieutenant Colonel was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in 2002 after graduating from Johns Hopkins University with a degree in Biomedical Engineering. Prior to her current assignment, she was the Environment, Safety, Occupational Health, Basing and Mission Sustainment Branch Chief for Headquarters A3 Operational Training Infrastructure Division. She was the sole A3 advisor, developer, interpreter of Environmental Safety and Occupational Health related policy and guidance pertaining to airspace and ranges. Lieutenant Colonel Peace's focus areas include noise impacts and abatement, environmental compliance, range safety and directed energy weapons safety. She drafts Air Force level guidance and policy on creation along with modifications of airspace, Air Traffic Control operations, airspace procedures and Remotely Piloted Aircraft integration.
